## **Chelsworth Park Success**

On Monday night 20<sup>th</sup> May, Council approved the proposal where Ivanhoe Grammar School will rebuild

the outdated pavilions and in return, receive a meaningful extension to its lease.

This is wonderful news as the proposed rebuild will provide us with shared accommodation at Chelsworth, a place to call home, a weight room and storage capacity.

- Good to see Brenton Hall back in action with a very good 12km run.
