Mabel had another fast 100m, Liam competed hard in all his events. David had a solid 1500 (4:06) after his 3k on Thursday. Kate was super strong in her 400 scoring 373 points and a PB in her 100m. Carla a good 3.93 Long Jump for 370 points and a PB in the 100m. Burkey completed in just 6 events this round, with his best a 1.53 High Jump for 340 points.

Perrin scorched down the track for a big PB in the 100m with 11:04 scoring 413 points into a slight head wind. The best performance of the day was a great win from Jamie leading from the front in the hot windy conditions for 3:59 and a massive 429 points. Well done everyone on some great performances.
