# President's Message

Since production of our last edition of Cursus there is quite a lot of news to report to our membership.

#### Willinda Park

After years of paying away substantial rent for little or no return, your Committee has decided to "bite the bullet" and exit Willinda Park. It makes no sense to continue paying out \$3,500.00 p.a. for a facility that is barely used. This has been a massive waste of hard earned resources with no recruiting pay-back.

In addition, it is very clear that since moving to Willinda Park, the Club has significantly declined and Diamond Valley Athletic Club has prospered at our expense. Recruiting from the diamond valley area has been very poor, we need to move on and embrace change to ensure the Club survives into the future without a millstone around our neck. Four years ago, prior to the Centennial Dinner, the Club was in a very poor state, today we are much stronger with options for the future and reasonable recruiting occurring.

The Committee has debated this problem over the past 3 years and has now, unanimously decided to exit Willinda Park. We have formally given notice as required and will exit Willinda Park on 30th November 2018.

It is acknowledged that this decision will impact on Coach, Peter Rule and Rhys Rigoni who is arguably our best current athlete. We hope that they continue to support the Club in its quest for growth and survival. We are confident that our training rights at Collingwood Track and Chelsworth Park will be attractive for all.

#### **Cross Country**

The Cross Country Season has just concluded and from an Ivanhoe Harriers perspective, our most successful season for probably 20 years. We have

increased our competing athletes to 15 and participation rate has improved. In the final event, the Tan Relays on Saturday, 15<sup>th</sup> September 2018 we fielded two relay teams with our number one team placing second in Division 5 and our number two team placing 6th in Division 7. There is a great team spirit developing in our distance running group, I can see similarities to our powerful cross country teams of the 80's. A full report from John David is later in this Cursus.

Track and Field season is fast approaching with Round 1 scheduled for Saturday 6<sup>th</sup> October 2018 at Aberfeldie and Round 2 on 13<sup>th</sup> October at Doncaster.

The dilemma with track availability for training looks to be resolving itself. The Collingwood Track at Clifton Hill has been significantly delayed in its resurfacing program however the latest news is that it should be available for training in October which will be excellent. Tom Hancock is back from his "wintering" in northern New South Wales and is ready to start with a new group of throwers.

We will notify members the moment training on the new track at Collingwood can commence.

On the other hand, the track at Willinda Park has just been ripped up and the Little Athletics program has been shifted to Meadowglen for the summer. This track is likely to be closed for 3-4 months at best, however, given our training rights at Chelsworth and Collingwood we are in good shape.

We are currently producing a new brochure for handout purposes at school sports events etc. Wayne Ramsay has kindly donated his time and expertise, we are hopeful that the brochure is a useful promotional tool going forward. Many thanks Wayne for your assistance, your long term loyalty to the Club is brilliant.
