Colin has had a long association with the Club dating back to the 70's, his son Neil joined the Club in the early 1970's.

For those with a copy of Andrew Edney's great history book, Colin is featured in a photo on page 120 which was taken at Noel Burrows house.

Andrew tells me that Colin worked in the State Electricity Commission where his Dad worked, they used to run together with a group at lunch times. Colin is an amazing man, his award is so well deserved.

He served in WW2 in 2/2nd Pioneer Battalion, is a survivor of the Burma Railway, his citation reads:

Damien is a member of our Team of the Century and holds our third fastest marathon time of 2 hours 30min 33sec, set in the Melbourne Marathon in 1992. Damien is also ranked 8th in our all-time rankings for the half marathon with a very good time of 68:31.

Damien was a key man in the building, management and leadership of our awesome middle distance and cross country teams in the 80's and 90's.

Damien was also a great "Team Man", he competed hard and often. Competed over all distances from the 1500m and 5000m on the track to Sandown Relays, 10k Road, 12k CC, 16k CC, Half Marathon and Marathon.

Outstanding success for athletics club

Five Ivanhoe Harriers chosen to wear Australian colors

FIVE local athletes have been chosen to represent Australia, four of them at the World Cross Country Championships in Norway next month.

Richard Russell, Glen Franklin, Malcolm Norwood and Darren Wilson are all members of the Ivanhoe Harriers Athletic Club.

They were selected by the Australian Athletics Union to compete in the championships.

Only 15 male athletes were chosen to compete in the Norway run from through-out Australia.

A fifth athlete, Damien Cook was selected to represent Australia in the Los Angeles Marathon which will be held on March 5.

Their selection has highlighted the prominent role that the Ivanhoe Harriers Athletics Club plays in athBy JOANNE CONNELL

The club, which now has 140 members, was formed by the headmaster of Ivanhoe Grammar, the Reverend S.L.Buckley in 1914.

It has been the stepping stone for many successful athletes, including silver medallist at the Los Angeles Olympics, Gary Honey.

And now the club's cross country runners are set to forge their way onto the world athletics stage.

Runners Richard Russell, 18, and Glen Franklin, 18, will represent Australia in the under-17 20km junior cross country team.

Both have a long list of impressive cross country wins at a national level, behind them.

Russell won the Australian All Schools under-17 4000m championship in Sydney in 1987 and then the under-19

8000m championships last

Franklin finished eighth in the Australian All Schools under-17 championships in 1987, but won the Victorian All Schools under-19 6000m in June last year.

He was also second in the Victorian under-18 1500m championships, and third in the Australian under 18 championships.

Both are former members of Ivanhoe Grammar where between them they hold records in cross country 800m, 1500m and 3000m events.

They were also joint cap-tains of the school's athletic team which won the Associated Grammar School Athletics Premiership in 1988 for the first time in 50 years.

Malcolm Norwood, 24, and Darren Wilson, 20, will represent Australia in Norway in the senior cross country team.

Norwood has won the Australian Cross Country Championships twice, won the New Zealand Cross Country Championships and the Victorian 12000m championships.

He was also a member of the Australian team which came second to Ethiopia in the World Challenge Relay in Chiba City, Japan, last December.

Wilson who is regarded by some as one of the best prospects in Australian athletics, ran second to Olympic runner Steve Monaghetti in the trials for the 1988 World Championships.

He is the current under-20 1500m, 5000m and 8000m cross country champion and won the Australian under 20 cross country champion-

ships in 1987. The World Cross Country

Championships at Stavanger, Norway will be held on March 19.
