Australia is hosting the World Cross Country Championships to be held at Bathurst on 18th February 2023 and a reunion is planned for past athletes who competed from 1981 to 1989. Invitations are being sent out, including to some of our past champions from Ivanhoe.

In 1989 at Stavanger in Norway, Ivanhoe Harriers representatives were Mal Norwood, Darren Wilson, Glenn Franklin and Richard Russell. Amazingly, four from Ivanhoe Harriers in the National Team that year. Also included in the invitation list is Steve Austin (1981) and of course the better known names of De Castella, Hoyle, Barrett, Moneghetti, Brad Camp (originally Ivanhoe Grammar School). This Editor fellow intends going with son Glenn, should be a very interesting adventure.

Winter Competition Results

Round 1 - was the cross country relays at Jells Park. The Team performance was very good with our top team placing second in Division 4, our second men's team placing 3rd in Division 6 and our young women's team placing 9th in the Under 16s.

The weather was windy and became a bit wet but our new marquee proved to be a marvellous new asset. Div. 4 Team was: Leo Worsam 22:20, Ben Morrison 22:21, David Greig 19:57, Harley Mileto 22:47 and Thomas Langdon 20:06. A very even performance and very impressive from our junior members, Leo and Harley.

Div. 6 Team of Claude Aquino 27:28, Josh Philip 23:03, Vince Mancuso 25:10 and Charles Shea 25:42 was also very even. Unfortunately we did not have a third team but David Burke ran a leg and recorded a time of 31:33.

Our Under 16 girls' team of Paige Bukovsan 13:01, Eliza Nelson 14:01 and Kate Bukovsan 12:56 was also very even. Kate's time was exceptional for an Under 14.

Of interest, had our top team been competing in the next higher Division, we would have placed 5th so our improvement is solid.

Round 2 - The 8km cross country at a new venue in Bendigo. A scenic and hilly course where we managed to hold down second place thanks to some excellent racing from David Greig, Thomas Langdon, Vince Mancuso, Claude Aquino and a sterling effort from David Burke, ensuring that we had a team.

Bendigo was always going to be a challenge for us, with travel time of about 2 hours. I was concerned beforehand that we would struggle to field a team. Individual performances were outstanding: David Greig (59th) in 27:28, Thomas Langdon (89th) in 28:21, Vince Mancuso (260th) in 36:44, Claude Aquino (283rd) in 38:37 and David Burke (321st) in 44:08.

This result means we comfortably hold down second place on the ladder.

Final team scores were:

- 1st Bendigo 329 points
- 2nd Ivanhoe 980
- 3rd Ballarat 1073
- 4th Collingwood 1129

Paige and Kate Bukovsan had their first real taste of cross country, flying the flag for the club and getting some great racing experience.

Paige place 14th in the Under 16 girls 3km in a time of 13:15. Kate placed 8th in the Under 14 girls 4km in 18:30.
