

## Vale - Noel Roberts

27<sup>th</sup> February 1958 - 10<sup>th</sup> June 2022

It is with deep regret we advise that Noel passed away on  $10^{th}$  June 2022.

Noel was a much loved former member of our Club who really enjoyed his cross country running and the fellowship of his many friends at the Ivanhoe Harriers.

This eulogy from old friend and loyal Harriers member, Bruce Ackland.

Noel Roberts joined Ivanhoe Harriers in 1971 and was one of a group of highly successful junior middle- and long-distance runners training under Chris Schrader. The group trained every week day down at Warringal Parklands, raced on Saturdays at the old Olympic Village Track (OVT), competed in the state championships, ran cross country during the winter months and revelled in Sunday morning pack runs. Noel was an important member of this group throughout his junior and early senior years and the friendships developed during that period lasted a life time.

Noel won the All-Tech 1500m championship in 1974 in the most exciting and gutsy fashion, leading from the start and holding off his fast-finishing rivals. Noel was a member of numerous state championship teams on the track and cross country. He was renowned for his grit, determination and courage throughout his competitive and casual running career which lasted most of his life. Even when he was no longer actively competing, he was always up for a run whenever the opportunity arose.

The club used to organise a tough hike up Mt Bogong most years and Noel was one of the enthusiastic club members who joined in this challenging experience. These hikes set Noel on a lifelong love of bushwalking and along with several other old 'hoe members set off on regular bush walks over the last 50 years. He completed the entire Australian Alps Walking Track from the ACT to Walhalla in stages (765 km all up, along with several other regular old club mates), and tramped many other trails up and down mountains with friends and family.

Noel was a passionate surfer, athlete, bushwalker, Collingwood FC tragic and above all else, family man. He developed friendships easily with his great humour, compassion and humility. Noel is survived by his wife Pam, four daughters and six grandchildren. He will be sadly missed and is gone far too early. We will miss him greatly.

Noel served on the Committee from 1976-1978 and was Club Secretary in the 1976/77 season. He competed for the Club during the 70s to the early 80s and was a quality middle distance runner.
