For those newer members, Sam Fragomeni competed for Ivanhoe 30 years ago in the early 90s when the Club had an amazingly strong middle distance group. They were almost an Australian Cross Country Team, including Mal Norwood, Darren Wilson, Glenn Franklin, Richard Russell, Malcolm Bruce, Michael Hillardt, Barry Greig, Adam Franklin, and Craig Rayner, just to name a few.

Sam was a fantastic competitor, never beaten. To this day Sam still holds the Club No. 3 All-time ranking for the 1500m with a time of 3:45.7 and the No. 5 All-time ranking in the 800m with a 1:51.8 which Michael Hillardt equalled in 1992.

Sam moved to Queensland in the late 1990s, but still receives his Cursus. Sam is now back in Melbourne living in Nth Fitzroy, it was so good to see him after all those years, a great member of a great team.


AVSL Round 4 Results
